Reading	<p>This quarter your child learned about how to read informational text.</p> <p>We can...identify text features. We can....read menus, recipes, schedules, flyers, directions, and labels. We can...ask and answer questions. We can.... Identify the main idea. We can... draw conclusions. We can... use prefixes and suffixes to define unknown words.</p>
Writing	<p>This quarter your child learned how to write a research writing.</p> <p>We can...research a topic. We can...write in complete sentences. We can... revise and edit our research draft.</p>
Math	<p>This quarter your child learned about repeating and growing patterns, even and odd numbers, identify 10 more, 10 less, 100 more, 100 less, 2-digit addition and subtraction, data and probability.</p> <p>We can...identify, create, and transfer repeating and growing patterns. We can...skip counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s up to 120. We can...use objectives to show even and odd. We can...add 100 to any 3-digit number. We can...use different strategies to solve 2-digit addition and subtraction problems. We can...tell time to the nearest 5 minutes. We can... create and record the results of a probability experiment. We can... collect and organize data. We can... show, read, and interpret data in a pictograph and bar graph.</p>
Science	<p>This quarter your child learned about solid, liquids, gases and animal habitats.</p> <p>We understand...how matter has mass and takes up space. We understand.... heating and cooling can change the phases of matter. We understand...plants and animals are interdependent with living and nonliving things. We understand... an animal’s habitat provides its basic needs. We understand... habitats changes over time due to many influences (natural and human) We understand... weather and seasonal changes affect the growth and behavior of living things.</p>

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Social Studies	<p>This quarter your child learned about geography.</p> <p>We can...find the equator, Prime Meridian, and four hemispheres on a map and globe.</p> <p>We can.... construct simple maps and a model of the globes and label the seven continents and five oceans.</p> <p>We can...read, label, and create a U.S. map identifying the James Rivers, the Mississippi River, the Rio Grande River, the Appalachian Mountains, the Rocky Mountains, and the Great Lakes.</p>
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
