<p>How to be a Fourth Grader</p> <p>Write a letter to an upcoming fourth grader. Explain to him or her what it is like being a fourth grader. Describe the different things you learn, and give advice on how to be successful. Two examples might be – always come to school prepared and when answering questions about a passage, always find your evidence.</p>	<p>Dear Ms. Stafford</p> <p>Write a letter to me describing your year in my class. Here are some suggestions on what you can include in your letter.</p> <p>What did you enjoy the most and the least? What was your favorite activity? What was your best day? What was your best accomplishment this year? What will you miss the most?</p>	<p>Acrostic Poem</p> <p>Create an acrostic poem about your school year. Write the alphabet vertically (like how you would number a paper), and then for each letter write a word or sentence that has to do with your 4th grade year. It can be about how you felt or something you did or learned. Here is an example for the first three letters.</p> <p>A – Adding fractions B – Bartering was a fun activity C – Cumulus clouds look like popcorn</p>
<p>Haiku Poem</p> <p>Create a Haiku poem about your school year. Remember a Haiku consists of three lines with a certain number of syllables.</p> <p>1st line – 5 syllables 2nd line – 7 syllables 3rd line – 5 syllables</p>	<p>Dear Future Teacher</p> <p>Write a letter to your future fifth grade teacher. What do you want him or her to know about you? Things you might include may be your favorite and least favorite subjects; your goals; your strengths and weaknesses.</p>	<p>Summer Plans</p> <p>Describe your “fake” summer plans. Fake plans might include going to outer space, visiting Bikini Bottom and staying with SpongeBob, or visiting a new country. Have fun and be creative.</p>
